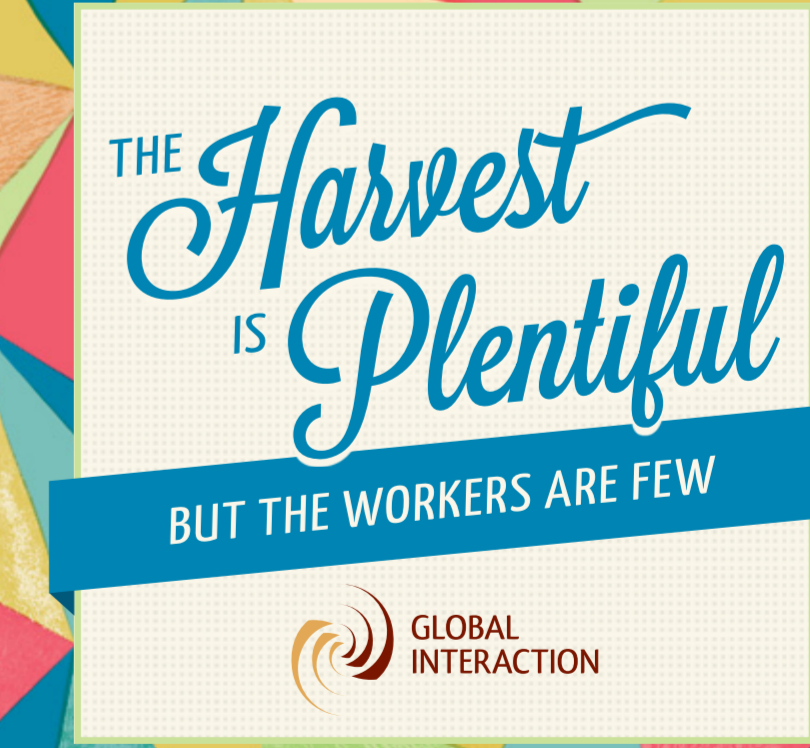

Introduction

THEME FOR 2016:

Luke 10:1-16

Introduction

Up until the end of Luke 8, the disciples have been following Jesus; they have been with Jesus, watching Jesus almost like passive spectators of Jesus' mission. But now they are invited to step out of the grandstand and onto the playing field. They are called to be participants in Jesus' missions. A process that began in chapter 9 with the sending of the 12 disciples is now continued with the sending of the 72 in chapter 10. As we easdop in on the mission of the 72 and through the lens the rest of Scripture, we find important things for us to grasp about Jesus' identity, His mission and subsequently our mission.

Ask someone in your congregation to share about how they stay focused on Jesus and the tasks God's harvest? Talk to someone who can help you be involved in ministry in your neighbourhood. He asks of them, What kind of things have they had to put aside in order to be a worker in the harvest?

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3 PERSON OF PEACE

KEY MESSAGE
Jesus sends the disciples into the town to tell the Good News about the Kingdom of God. But like our lives, they were surrounded by lots of people so Jesus gives instructions to look for 'a person of peace', someone who welcomes you into their life.

The disciples were from the Jewish community and they followed strict rules on what they could/could not eat. Jesus tells them to eat what they are offered. When you get to spend time with people they may do things differently to you so this requires us to be flexible and respect them as we share Jesus' love.

MEMORY VERSE
Luke 10:7 (NIV) "Do not move around from house to house."

ACTIVITIES
Stay or Go?, What Are You Looking For?, Another way

PRAYER
Jesus thank you for loving me. Please help me to share your love with people in a kind, respectful and peaceful way.

TAKE HOME
Is there someone you would like to get to know more? Could you spend some more time with them – maybe eat some lunch together?
Try doing/eating something different this week!

4 SHARING THE KINGDOM OF GOD

KEY MESSAGE
We are to tell people about Jesus and the love, peace, hope and joy He offers. We are also to show people that we follow Jesus by our actions.

MEMORY VERSE
Matthew 6:10 "Your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven."

ACTIVITIES
Kingdom Cards, Kingdom Characters, Do It Again

PRAYER
Thank you God that your love, peace, and joy is for all people. Help me to share it with my words and actions.

TAKE HOME
Remind yourself of this phrase: If at first you don't succeed – try again!
Collect stamps or coins to support a cross-cultural worker or project which is helping to share Jesus through words and actions all across the world.

5 BEING PART OF THE SOLUTION

KEY MESSAGE
The problem is that there aren't enough people sharing the Good News of Jesus with the people on the earth. How can we be part of the solution? We need to be a worker so that when people meet us they get to meet Jesus.

MEMORY VERSE
Matthew 5:16 "Let your good deeds shine out for all to see"

ACTIVITIES
Copycat, Problem Solver, Bright Light

PRAYER
Thank you God for creating a beautiful world and wonderful people. Please help me to make good decisions so that I can help this world be a better place.

TAKE HOME
This week try and copy one of Jesus' characteristics such as being kind or fair.

3 WEEK

Person of Peace

Luke 10:5-8

APPLICATION
Mark helps us to understand how to find a person of peace among other cultures.

RESPONSE
It is important for labourers of the harvest to approach their mission with grace and peace. When you are involved in ministry to your neighbours or through your church do you reveal himself to those who don't know Him. If you have a sense that God might be calling you to go to the least-reached, make an appointment and speak with your pastor.
Give to an organisation, such as Global Interaction or a person that helps share the Good News to people who do not yet know Jesus.

INSIDER STORY
In the next three weeks resolve to invite someone to your home for a meal. Could you consider someone you don't know well but would like to know better?

2 WEEK

Travel Lightly

Luke 10:4

APPLICATION
Huana shares the importance of traveling lightly when entering a new community.

RESPONSE
Write down three things in your life that is holding you up in your relationship with Jesus. Lift them up in prayer and give them over to God during the service.
What is distracting you from being involved in God's harvest? Talk to someone who can help you be involved in ministry in your neighbourhood. He asks of them, What kind of things have they had to put aside in order to be a worker in the harvest?

INSIDER STORY
Ask someone who has a mission connection at your church to share how they went about sharing the Good News about Jesus. How did they know whether to continue in certain relationships, or when they were to walk away?

4 WEEK

The Kingdom of God is Near

Luke 10:9-11

APPLICATION
Followers of Jesus: their witness to the Kingdom of God through their word authentically by their actions - participate intentionally in activities outside of church - should expect people to reject Jesus of the Kingdom? - need to be resilient and keep going.

INSIDER STORY
Hold an evangelism Q&A session to equip people to share their faith in words and actions and to help them build a repository of discerned stories. Ask someone who has a mission connection at your church to share how they went about sharing the Good News about Jesus. How did they know whether to continue in certain relationships, or when they were to walk away?

RESPONSE
How could you be more intentional about your relationships and weekly activities for the work of the Kingdom?
Hold an evangelism Q&A session to equip people to share their faith in words and actions and to help them build a repository of discerned stories. Ask someone who has a mission connection at your church to share how they went about sharing the Good News about Jesus. How did they know whether to continue in certain relationships, or when they were to walk away?

GO

Partner with a worker or a project and directly impact the ministry of our teams.

LEARN

Study Luke 10 and tease out what it says to us about Jesus, His mission and ultimately our mission as local churches that are seeking to make an impact both across the street and across the globe.

Projects 2016

PRIORITY MINISTRY INITIATIVES

Global Interaction cross-cultural workers serve in teams among least-reached people groups and funding their ministry is our greatest financial need. Contact us or visit our website for information about supporting our workers. These projects represent key ministry priorities for 2016.

Culture and Language learning – training teams to effectively communicate with local people

Medical cover – covering regular health checks and emergencies in all locations

Schooling – ensuring appropriate education is provided for the children of our cross-cultural workers

NURTURING FAITH COMMUNITIES

Global Interaction desires to see established faith groups flourish through their own Indigenous leaders.

Making Disciples & Maturing Partners – This project will encourage, equip and empower believers who left the city and returned to their communities located in various regions of Thailand. It includes discipleship and training of local leaders so that they are able to disciple believers and witness in their surrounding communities. It also will provide resources to keep them growing in their faith and can be utilised in their own Gospel sharing.

Training Church Leaders – One of the most effective teaching methods used in the Outback is training camps where church leaders 'head out bush'. By sitting with leaders of the communities and discussing issues, teaching and encouraging discussion on various Biblical themes, Bill and Pauline are able to empower the leaders to teach in their own language and in their own distinctive ways.

Kyaka Enga Bible Revision – The Baptist Union of Papua New Guinea (BUPNG), along with a team of Baptists in the Highlands of PNG and some Australian consultants, are undertaking a project to revise the Kyaka Enga Bible translation. The current translation was completed over 30 years ago and there are no remaining copies available. This project aims to ensure that the current Kyaka Enga Bible is updated to be linguistically accurate for this generation of Kyaka Enga people of PNG, providing access to the Word of God in their own heart language.

EDUCATION AND TRAINING

Global Interaction is working in rural settings where there is a lack of education and technical skills training. These projects assist people to practically provide for their families, further their employment opportunities and be equipped for their roles.

Education Plus – Our team, working with our partner NGO, in South Asia facilitate skills training for Bengali people so that they can gain education qualifications they otherwise could not afford. The project seeks to increase their employment options, improve their quality of life and help lift families out of poverty.

English Teaching and Friendship – The team provides English language lessons to local students in their rural community. These skills will improve further education and employment prospects of the local K people while also providing the opportunity for the team to build trusting relationships in the local community.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Global Interaction teams live in communities with least-reached people and focus on bringing whole-of-life transformation.

Lanternlight Ministries: Community Based Rehabilitation – This project works with over 150 people with disabilities living in on the Thai/Myanmar border providing support, rehabilitation and the love of Jesus. Jit and Jan partner with local believers to develop a sense of responsibility towards those in need in their communities.

Community Environmental Improvement – With a passion for caring about creation and long-term sustainability of our world, the South-East Asia team is pioneering a not-for-profit organisation which will encourage local community action for environmental care. Programs include targeted environmental rehabilitation projects, community composting programs and community rubbish clean-up events to best look after the local environment for future generations.
